Contract Awarded for Construction of Restaurant Pavilion on Veteran's Pier





Arco Construction Group of Elizabeth will construct a \$2.26 million restaurant pavilion adjacent to Veteran's Pier in Carteret Waterfront Park on the Arthur Kill.

Mayor Daniel J. Reiman has announced that the Borough has awarded a \$2,259,000 for the construction of a restaurant pavilion on the waterfront to Elizabeth-based Arco Construction Group.

The project entails a 70 by 46-foot, 3,220-square foot seasonal pavilion that will operate from spring through fall, as well as a 6 by 25-foot access gangway on Veteran's Pier in Waterfront Park.

"Great things continue to happen for our wonderful waterfront increasing its appeal as a destination for residents and visitors," Mayor Reiman said. "The pavilion will be a welcomed addition to the many popular waterfront events the Borough frequently presents, including our Independence Day Festival, Latin Fest, and weekly summer concert series."

The pavilion will be connected to Veteran's Pier, Mayor Reiman said. Two-thirds of the project will be paid for with a \$1.5 million county grant, the Mayor said

The exiting new phase of improvements in the park will in no way impact access to the fishing areas available at or on the waterfront pier, Chief of Staff Frank Bellino added.

"As is authorized by New Jersey state law and NJDEP Green Acres regulations, this covered pavilion is to provide our residents and visitors with added amenities, such as lite refreshments, a beverage or snow cone at Waterfront Park," Bellino said. "This will greatly improve the amenities that we already offer at the waterfront and make this a more enjoyable and open public destination for everyone."

Coinciding with the pavilion is a 25-foot cooking trailer built by Maryland-based Mobile Kitchens USA. The mobile kitchen will be based in Watefront Park near the gazebo.

Recreational features within Waterfront Park also include a marina, a mini golf course, a putting green, a volleyball court, an exercise trail, and a bocce court. Current waterfront construction includes an expansion of the northern and southern pier extension. Future plans include a movie studio and hotel with rooftop amenities, restaurants and retail adjacent to the forthcoming Carteret Intermodal Transportation Building that also will feature rooftop amenities, restaurants and retail, as well as office space, a bar lounge and more.

More than a century ago, Carteret's waterfront was residential and public, but in the 1890s, chemical companies acquired the properties, took down the colonial mansions along the waterfront and created a "chemical coastline," Mayor Reiman said.

Throughout its 21-year tenure, the Reiman administration has been taking back these properties, fighting private polluters and bureaucratic agencies to provide what is now miles of public access along the Carteret waterfront, as well as active and passive recreational amenities.

"Carteret Waterfront Park is an award-winning urban waterfront public park that we are proud to have," Bellino said.

"We've gone after DuPont Chemical, U.S. Metals," Mayor Reiman added. "We've sued and won natural resource damages cases against all of these polluters requiring that they provide public space, open space, access to the waterfront. Taking back these properties, requiring them to clean up the properties, to pay civil penalties to the Borough that we're using to provide these public amenities."

The state Department of Environmental Protection approved a Water Framework Directive In-Water Permit and a Water Quality Certificate authorizing the construction of the restaurant pavilion.

Intermodal Transportation Building receives \$5.6M USDOT RAISE Grant

The Borough is the only New Jersey recipient of the highly competitive \$5.6 million grant from the U.S. Department of Transportation, Mayor Daniel J. Reiman recently announced.

The Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) Grant will help with the construction of the 47,000 square-foot Carteret Intermodal Transportation Building, the hub

of the Borough's forthcoming ferry service.

"This is a highly competitive grant to which towns, counties and states from all over the country, can apply and compete," Mayor Reiman said. "It's an extremely difficult grant to obtain, so we are very grateful to President Biden and the U.S. Department of Transportation for investing infrastructure funds into this intermodal ferry terminal. This program would not be possible without the implementation of the 2021 Bipartisan Infrastructure Bill championed by Congressional leaders like Frank Pallone."

When he signed the Bipartisan Infrastructure Bill, President Joe Biden said, "This is an investment that's going to connect entire towns and regions to new opportunities. With this investment, we're sending a message to those communities and to the people who

call them home: You matter!"

U.S. Secretary of Transportation Pete Buttigieg added, "In communities across the country, there is a tremendous need for transportation projects that create high-quality jobs, improve safety, protect our environment, and generate equitable economic opportunity for all Americans. With RAISE grants,

we are making those needed investments in our communities' future."

Carteret has become a very desirable location to live, work, and raise a family. The Reiman administration has fought for years to increase Carteret's economic competitiveness, and to create opportunity for growth through new residential and commercial development, the newly constructed Carteret Performing **Events** Center. Arts and upgraded parks, and stable tax rates. The addition and implementation of this new public transportation option will positively impact the community economically. Creating ferry travel opportunities also is a critical component to opening waterfront areas and increasing access to work and recreation activities.

Among thousands of applicants throughout U.S. and its territories, the extremely the competitive RAISE Grant is awarded to only a recipients handful of transportation infrastructure projects. projects must improve safety, environmental sustainability, quality of life, community connectivity, and economic competitiveness and opportunity, including tourism, collaboration and innovation.

Carteret Intermodal Transportation Building will provide access to several forms of alternative transportation. In addition to a ferry to New York City, a Borough jitney service, NJ Transit bus service, and bicycling and walking will be available.

Construction starts on ferry in-water & uplands improvements

Mayor Daniel J. Reiman has announced that the Borough has awarded contracts for the next phases of both in-water and uplands construction of the forthcoming ferry terminal.

Howell-based George Harms Construction Co. was awarded \$7,945,299 million for in-water construction work, while Old Bridge-based Black Rock Enterprises was awarded \$6,414,165.15 million

for uplands construction.

"This is truly an exciting time for Carteret," Mayor Reiman said. "Soon the ferry will safely and efficiently deliver commuters from Carteret and the surrounding area every day to downtown Manhattan and the Financial District."

In the wake of state Department of Transportation approvals, construction of a ferry terminal will include an in-water fixed pier, floating docks for passenger loading and unloading, connecting gangways, timber ramps, a wave screen, and steel

piles, according to design plans.

A timber staircase will connect the floating dock with one of three ferry boats, and two parallel aluminum gangways will connect the fixed pier to the floating dock. A fixed pier will be 25-feet long by 16-feet wide, and the floating dock will be 40-feet long by 40-feet wide with gangways measuring 65-feet long by 5-feet wide.

The upland phase will include a 700-space parking lot, lighting, utilities, and to mitigate storm water runoff, inlets, porous pavement, and high density polyethylene and reinforced concrete pipes.

Construction has started and will be completed by Spring 2025.

"Once the waterside improvements are done, we will operate a ticket booth out of a kiosk and an app on a smart phone until the Carteret Intermodal Transportation Building is completed," Mayor Reiman said.

Funding came from grants from NJDOT, U.S. Department of Environmental Protection, Federal Transit Authority. The Reiman Administration secured milhas lion federal and state grants, including several competitive funds, such aforementioned 2022 FTA grant and a 2023 Congressional appropriation.

The bulkhead for the ferry terminal was completed in October 2022. NJDOT Office of Maritime Resources completed the dredging in January 2023.

RAISE Grant continued

Amongst its transportation component, the building also will include an Educational Center that will act as a training hub for ferry staff, plus public amenities, such as a grab-and-go automated grocery store, quick service grille, casual dining restaurant and roof top that offers views of the NYC skyline.

The Borough recently awarded contracts for the next phases of both in-water and uplands construction of the forthcoming ferry terminal. The bulkhead for the ferry terminal was completed in October 2022. NJDOT Office of Maritime Resources

completed the dredging in January 2023.

"This is truly an exciting time for Carteret," Mayor Reiman said. "After years of studies and permitting through what seems like the endless bureaucracy of government agencies, we will soon reinstate ferry service, which will safely and efficiently deliver commuters from Carteret and the surrounding area every day to New York City."

For the ferry project, the Reiman Administration

has secured more than \$70 million in federal and state grants, including several other competitive funds, such as a 2022 Federal Transit Authority grant and a

2023 Congressional appropriation.

The planned intermodal transportation building is part of a larger multi-year, \$1.5 billion redevelopment plan to transform the Borough's waterfront into a regional transportation, economic and recreational hub and destination. In addition to Waterfront Park, Veteran's Pier, and Carteret Municipal Marina, which have already been completed. The waterfront redevelopment plans include the private construction of a 500,000-square-foot film production studio, and 150,000 square feet of ancillary retail and hotel space on private property adjacent to the ferry terminal



The Dominican-born Acosta formed the band in 1994 in Jersey City and now is based in Florida.

This award is a testament to our collective commitment to the Borough of Carteret and driving positive change in our community. I share this recognition with all those who work tirelessly to transform Carteret into a thriving hub of opportunity and growth."

The Mayor was nominated for the award by Clark Machemer, Crow Holdings Development's Senior Managing Director for the Northeast Region.

Crow Holdings at Carteret features 1.2 million square feet of warehouse space on a remediated brownfield site off New Jersey Turnpike Interchange 12 in the Borough's Landfill Redevelopment District. In his NAIOP nomination, Machemer said, "This mayor and municipality understand that development is an economic stimulant and driver for growth. They understand how to work with developers. When you go in with a proposal, they tell you what you can and cannot do. That's music to any developer's ear and is attributable to Mayor Reiman's own vision for the town. And he has used -- and continues to use – development for the betterment of his community.

"Mayor Reiman and the Borough were determined to take back a 126-acre former brownfield site and transform it from an environmental challenge to an economic success," the nomination continued. "And from the start, the Borough was a great supporter of Crow Holdings at Carteret. Today, our three-building property at Salt Meadow Road is ready for occupancy just a half mile from Turnpike Exit 12. This campus, which has introduced a new world-class warehouse/distribution opportunity in the heart of the Greater Port submarket — and already secured its first tenant in Weida Freight Systems — is a quintessential illustration of public-private partnership at its best."



Biz Profile: Virginia Dare Extract Co.

In the wake of celebrating its 100th anniversary, flavor industry leader Virginia Dare Extract Co. recently moved its international headquarters to its extensively renovated Carteret location.

The state-of-the-art 206,500-square-foot facility at 900 Federal Blvd. is twice the size of its previous Brooklyn location, where the company has operated since 1923, celebrating its centennial last year. The move brings more than 200 nutrition experts, researchers and technicians to Carteret with 90 percent employee retention, along with more local jobs that will be created, the company said.

Meanwhile, Virginia Dare also opened a California-based product development laboratory in Pasadena.

"Our added capabilities at the new headquarters and at a new location in California have experienced new hires, which will allow us to simplify and enhance our in-person collaboration with customers from coast to coast," Virginia Dare President Howard Smith Jr. said. "Virginia Dare has built a legacy over the past century of providing high-quality flavors and extracts. Now we are positioned to continue serving the industry into the future."

The Carteret site has been leased by Virginia Dare since 2019. However, it has not fully utilized the entire space until January of this year.

Named after the first English child born to settlers of the "new world" in America, Virginia Dare said it looked at many potential sites and chose one just 10 minutes away from Newark Liberty International Airport to make it much easier for customers and other guests to visit. The facility is 20 miles away from its former location.

The upgraded facility includes modern prep kitchens and world-class test facilities.

"It has ample capacity to accommodate continued growth toward the next century of flavor innovation," Smith said.



CPAC Spotlight: Scott Bradlee's Postmodern Jukebox



Scott Bradlee's Postmodern Jukebox perform vintage arrangements of today's hits. They will return July 18 to URSB Carteret Performing Arts & Events Center.

Even in our futuristic age of AI chat bots and virtual realities, there still is nothing in the world that compares with the thrill of hearing classic genres of music performed by a group of exceptional singers and musicians that have truly mastered the ability to move an audience.

That's the philosophy behind Scott Bradlee's Postmodern Jukebox, who are celebrating their 10th anniversary of touring with The 10 Tour, which comes July 18 to URSB Carteret Performing Arts & Events Center.

Three years before the retro-sounding music collective hit the road, they began reanimating today's pop hits via YouTube videos in such styles of yesteryear as ragtime, jazz, swing, big band, country & western, doo wop and soul. When their 2012 video of their Jazz Era-style, "Great Gatsby"-like cover of the Seattle-based hip-hop duo Macklemore & Ryan Lewis' "Thrift Shop" went viral, the live demands for the Queens, N.Y.-based PMJ came pouring in, as did requests for albums. A year later, PMJ's debut LP, "Introducing Postmodern Jukebox" was released, peaking at No. 8 on the Billboard Jazz Charts. They since have released more than 30 albums, including

the 2016 compilation, "The Essentials," which made it to No. 2 on the Billboard Jazz Chart.

Each week, the band releases a video to 6.24 million YouTube subscribers. Meanwhile, that "Thrift Shop" clip has gotten 17 million views.

Living up to the band's motto, "Today's Hits Yesterday," The 10 Tour set list has included 1920s-style covers of Dua Lipa's "Levitating" and Carley Rae Jepsen's "Call Me Maybe," a "Singin' in the Rain"-inspired version of Rihanna's "Umbrella," a Motown take on Beyonce's "Halo," and a torch song interpretation of Radiohead's "Creep."


For those seeing PMJ for the first time at Carteret PAC, dressing in vintage attire is encouraged.
